- 1. Rights and Services for Immigrant Families (pass amend) Children and Youth. Passed as amended. This replaces resolution 18.25
- 2. 2.22 Digital and Internet Safety amendment. Passed as amended.
- 3. 2.19 LGBTQIA2S+ Inclusion amendment (2S="two spirit" is a culturally specific term used by indigenous people) -Valerie, Everett PTSA Council and JHS PTSA member, presented. amended and passed
